
- Collaborate with subject matter experts to create guidance documents

Informatics, Performance & Analytics

- •Financial stewardship including developing the annual operational and grant budget for:

 - -Compliance with Canadian Institute of Health Information
 - -Operational best practice submissions
 - -Financial variance monitoring
 - -Activity based budgeting

Procurement & Inventory

The Procurement and Inventory team serves as a provincial resource for all pharmacy purchasers, in addition to providing provincial direction, team leadership and organization over activities pertaining to Pharmacy Services drug purchasing and inventory control.

- Backorder database
- Monitor inventory
- Coordinate movement of inventory (drug shortages)
- Works in conjunction with HealthPRO
- Pharmacy Purchasing liaison



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Distribution Optimization Team (DOT)

- provides support and consultation regarding drug production and distribution in two areas:
 - Equipment
 - Automation & Technology Distribution Processes
- help AHS Pharmacy sites meet and exceed the minimum Pharmacy Services' Drug Distribution standards as well as other regulatory standards.
- assists with the strategic and intelligent use of pharmacy automation and coordination of capital equipment purchases
- DOT provides coordination and strategic oversight of 700 pieces of capital equipment ranging from refrigerators and freezers to biological safety cabinets and automated medication packaging machines.


