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Why working with the Technical Practice Team is a valuable experience as a student: Pharmacy Technician Student Distribution Position




Position Overview

- Temporary full-time role for post-secondary students to gain exposure to hospital pharmacy operations from a procedural lens
- Focus on developing professional skill sets while they perform duties under direct supervision
- Primary tasks include updating and revising materials, developing tools, and creating educational presentations
- May include opportunities to shadow a pharmacy technician and participate in an active practice day



Why Apply?

- Opportunity to explore lesser-known roles of Pharmacy Technicians
- Hands-on experience with the technical side of pharmacy practice, typically gained later in a career
- Exposure to the pharmacy community and chance to build connections with peers, mentors and professionals
- Insight into why changes are needed and how they are implemented







Position & Grant Criteria

Position Eligibility:

- Completed first year of a two-year Albertaaccredited Pharmacy Technician diploma program
- Currently enrolled in the second year of the program
- Fluent in English (both written and verbal)
- Accurate, reliable, self-motivated, and cooperative
- Able to work independently and as part of a team

Grant Eligibility:

- Between 19 and 30 years old at the position start date
- Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or protected person under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act
- Legally eligible to work in Canada



Additional Skills

- Experience in hospital or retail pharmacy is not required but an asset
- Understanding of pharmacy workflow is beneficial
- Familiarity with Microsoft Teams, Word, PowerPoint, OneNote and Excel is an asset
- Strong communication, interpersonal, and time management skills are desired
- Excellent organizational, problem-solving, and decision-making abilities are highly valued



Job Timing & Commitment

When is the position posted?

 Application opens in early March and closes by late March

When would I work?

- Summer position, usually between the first and second year of studies
- Weekday shifts with flexible daytime start times

How long is this temporary role?

- Can start as early as May and run through to the end of August
- Duration ranges from 6 to 16 weeks

Application Tips

- Confirm you meet all position and grant requirements before applying
- Include a cover letter with your application
- Use keywords from the job posting that reflect your qualifications
- After uploading your resume to the AHS website, verify and edit your imported information as needed.
